residential and commercial designations because the City cannot designate private property as Public Use; and a discussion ensued about other potential changes, which will be presented in the next meeting packet for final review. Commissioner Berndt asked whether there were proposed areas for expanded UGA. Commissioner Graham asked for more industrial south of the railroad tracks and earmarked as entry areas within the City (entry commercial).

#### d. Review potential Comprehensive Plan goals & policies amendments – Gregg Dohrn

Mr. Dohrn presented the Draft potential Goals & Policies revision to include with the Comprehensive Plan Amendment along with the Future Land Use Map (FLUM). Mr. Dohrn flagged the various additions and suggested some would be reviewed again at the next meeting.

# e. <u>Review map highlighting priority areas for future property acquisitions – Gregg</u> Dohrn

Mr. Dohrn committed discuss strategic priorities for identifying properties around the City that could potentially be in a place to acquire or protect at the next meeting. Commissioners discussed general priorities for future habitat or open space protection.

#### b. <u>Design Guidelines – Bobby Graham / Elizabeth Torrey</u>

Commissioner Graham included examples of design standards from other communities that include simple standards with graphics with easy examples (e.g., Chelan, Port Orchard, etc.) that the City could use as a starting point. Commissioner Torrey expressed full support for the design guideline development. Commissioner Berndt suggested providing an example to Council for a preliminary approval to develop a code.

#### 10. Commissioner Comments and Discussion

Commissioner Berndt committed to working on the next agenda and keeping the design standards moving forward. Commissioner Fluegge asked whether staff and planning consultants have discussed big picture planning of Cle Elum, while we are looking at the details of land use and zoning. Staff commented that those discussions had not happened, but that once the required FLUM/OZM, and other required actions such as updating the Flood Hazard Prevention ordinance, there will be time to prioritize the higher-level planning efforts. Staff committed to opening that conversation with Mr. Dohrn and bringing the conversation back at the next meeting. Commissioner Torrey suggested in the future to have a longer retreat to discuss these items in person.
